Community Needs Survey

On May 15, 2019 the Board of Supervisors received the final report on the long awaited Community Needs Survey that was commissioned in late 2018.

While the Township had conducted several surveys in the past, this was the first statistically significant sample survey that it had undertaken community wide. The Board hired Camp Hill, PA based Field Goals.US, which prepared the survey instrument.

The genesis of the survey was the result of some public meetings early last year, at which time the Board had considered closing the fitness center because of the increasing competition from private fitness establishments. The Board was acting on a recommendation from the Township Administration to de-emphasize the fitness component in favor of more non-fitness programming options.

The early recommendation, however, was met with

stiff resistance from the Center's active members.

Recreation Center Under New Management

At its May 20, 2019 regular meeting, the Board of Supervisors unanimously accepted the Township Administration's recommendation to contract out the management of the Center's operations to Integrated Fitness Partners (IFP). Based out of its corporate offices in Ambler, PA, IFP manages several area fitness centers throughout the Philadelphia region, including the municipal centers at Montgomery and Upper Merion Townships.

"After many false starts, we realized we did not have the required expertise to run the fitness center successfully and efficiently," stated Township Manager Timothy J. Tieperman. (Continued on Page 7)

Also recognized for service were Sergeant Matthew Tobin and Detective Sergeant Patrick Haines. Both of these officers completed 21 years of service in 2019.

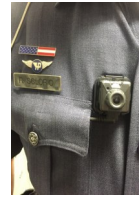

CRIMEWATCH



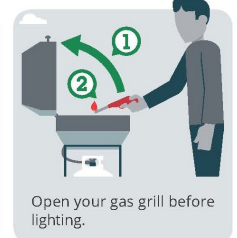

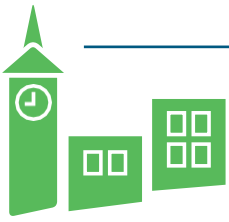

Under Construction

Founders Reserve – WB Homes is currently building 31 single family detached homes near Valley View and Borough Line Road.

Global Packaging – A 225,000 square foot manufacturing / warehouse building on Hollow Road east of the Meadows Condominiums is currently under construction.

Morgan Tract – A combination of 89 residential units (single homes and townhouses) on the east side of Route 29 south of Black Rock Road.

Jeb Group – 60,000 square feet of self-storage buildings at Ridge Pike and Kline Road.

Sewer Rate Adjustment

The Township has received numerous inquiries from residents regarding the recent sewer bill increase as well as inquiries about the Township's newly contracted billing service.

The Township's 2019 Budget includes a \$26.50 quarterly rate adjustment, a portion of which covers recent increases enacted by the Lower Perkiomen Valley Regional Sewer Authority. This local Authority receives and processes all effluent from the Township's sanitary sewer collection system.

Another portion of the rate adjustment is earmarked to stabilize Upper Providence's sewer capital reserves to help properly maintain the Township's aging sewer collection system infrastructure.

In an effort to streamline costs, in 2019 the Township privatized its sewer billing and contracted with Berkheimer Associates. "The timing of this adjustment in addition to this new privatized billing service unfortunately confused many residents," stated Township Manager Tim Tieperman, "and we sincerely apologize for this confusion. We will certainly make an effort to more effectively communicate changes in the future."

"While we understand that this adjustment surprised many people, the Township still has among the lowest sewer rates in the region," stated Tieperman.

To further help defray the cost of collecting sewer rates, the Township is looking to transition to semi annual billing in 2020. ❖

Wash Your Car Properly

It is vital to keep our waterways clean. Protective measures should also be taken when washing a car. The best action is to take your vehicle to a commercial car wash so those chemicals do not end up in your drinking water.



If you still want to wash your car at home, do so on gravel, grass or other permeable surface. Use soap sparingly and rinse your vehicle quickly. Instead of dumping the bucket of soapy water down the street, empty the bucket into the sink. It is also recommended by the Philadelphia Water Department that if having a charity car wash event, block off the storm drain and/or insert a vacuum pump to catch the water. This water too should be emptied into a sink. ❖

Mailbox Policy

A new policy was adopted by the Board of Supervisors to replace mailboxes damaged from municipal snowplowing activities or other Township-sponsored road maintenance. Individuals whose mailbox was damaged as verified by UPT, can now receive a payment of \$85 to cover the cost of replacement. ❖

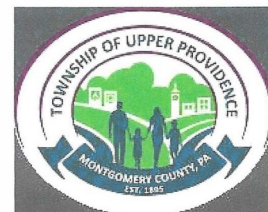

“We did not anticipate such a vociferous reaction from our members,” stated Township Manager Timothy J. Tieper-

man. “We underestimated their passion for preserving the health and wellness component of the Center. And quite frankly,” stated Tieperman, “we did not have definitive information on the types of alternative programs that would be offered. This is exactly why we decided to invest our resources to conduct a true random sample survey of our residents, not only to ascertain residents’ desires for the Recreation Center but also the Township’s entire park and open space system.”

The final survey analysis included four key recommendations: (1) improve community awareness of the Recreation Center and its programs; (2) include a library programming component; (3) prepare better maps and guides of the Township's existing trail networks; and (4) include more playground improvements to meet the needs of a growing population.

(Continued from Page 1) “With the proliferation of niche fitness establishments popping up all over the area, including discount places like Planet Fitness and numerous 24/7 establishments, we decided to enlist the assistance of skilled fitness professionals to help manage the facility more efficiently and market it more effectively,” said Tieperman.



Mr. David Rambo, one of IFP’s managing partners, is overseeing the transition of operations which should be fully complete by June 30, 2019.

Stated Rambo, “IFP is thrilled and grateful to partner with the Township to build upon its rich history of community-centered service. We’re excited to bring our specific industry expertise in the health and wellness field and of equal importance, experience working successfully with other municipal recreation centers to deliver an engaging, family friendly experience to the entire Upper Providence region.”

With these planned management changes, there will be no interruption in service, nor will there be any reduction in service hours. IFP’s new Center team will comprise one full-time program manager and two full-time program assistants.

With this new professional team, members should expect new fitness offerings in the near future as well as more health and wellness clinics for community residents. ♦
