

Open Space Preservation

The Upper Providence Township Board of Supervisors is currently in discussions about the preservation of open space within the township.

In response to inquiries from concerned residents, the Board is considering adopting a resolution that would authorize the placement of a question on the ballot for an upcoming election.

The proposed question would ask the voters of Upper Providence Township whether they assent to incurring debt for the purpose of financing the acquisition of interests in real property for the preservation of environmental areas and open space for passive recreational purposes and benefits within the township.

While discussions are still in their early stages, the Board wants residents to know that preserving open space is a top priority for both the Supervisors and the township as a whole. The beauty and natural resources of our community are important assets that must be protected for future generations.

The Board will continue to keep residents informed as this initiative progresses. We encourage all members of our community to stay engaged and provide feedback as we work towards preserving our open spaces.

Road Work Alert: Black Rock Road Closure

Motorists are advised of the following travel restriction: Monday, May 12, through Monday, December 1, Black Rock Road will be closed and detoured 24/7 between Upper Indian Head Road and Ashenfelter Road. During the closure, motorists will be directed to use Egypt Road, and Route 29 (Bridge Street/Collegeville Road).

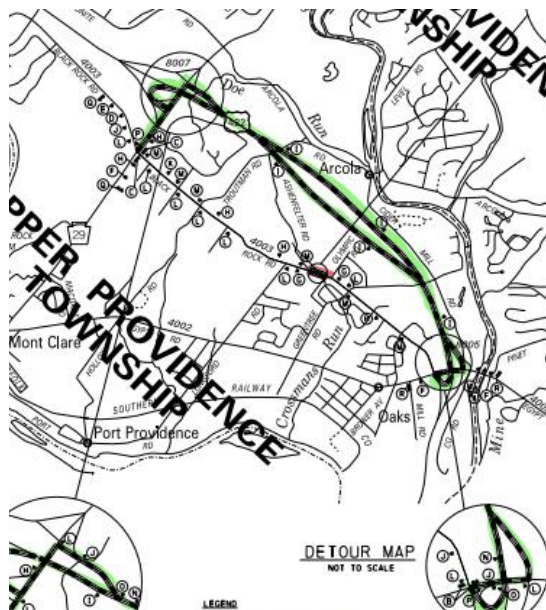
Local access will be maintained up to the work zone. Drivers are advised to allow extra time when traveling near the work area because backups and delays may occur. The single-span, two-lane, Black Rock Road bridge over Crossmans Run was built in 1925. The bridge is 12 feet long, 22 feet wide and carries approximately 7,796 vehicles per day.

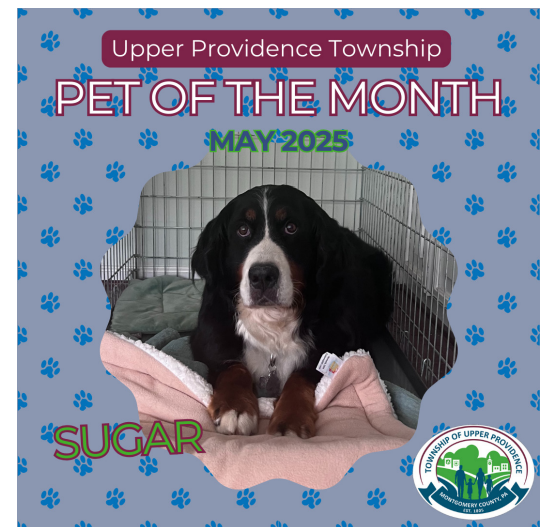

Fire and Emergency Services News

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Funding Changes

The Upper Providence Township Supervisors enacted a property tax for Emergency Medical Services (EMS), specifically as a financial contribution to the Contracted EMS Provider.

The three Contracted EMS Providers are Friendship Ambulance, Lower Providence Ambulance, and Freedom Valley Medical Rescue. This property tax covers all EMS Services regardless of the responding provider.

The residents of the township will not be required to contribute to the Contracted EMS Provider for membership which offset costs not covered by medical insurance. The township contribution will replace the resident membership.

The benefits, limitations, and restrictions are listed as follows:

- 100 percent of households in the township are covered minus any medical deductible the medical insurance policy may have and must be met.
- Township residents are covered regardless of the dispatched 911 location, but the location must be in Upper Providence Township.
- Two lift assist services per calendar year are covered.
- Businesses, companies, or other non-residential locations are not covered.
- EMS calls where treatment was rendered with no-transport are not covered.
- EMS transports that are denied or determined to be unnecessary by the insurance company are not covered.

The resident must provide all insurance information to the Contracted EMS Provider and by virtue of this resolution agree the payment of the authorized Medicare benefits or other insurance benefits be made on their behalf. They also authorize any holder of medical information or documentation about the patient that can be released to the Health Care Administration and its carrier and agents as needed to determine benefits payable for the Contracted EMS Provider.

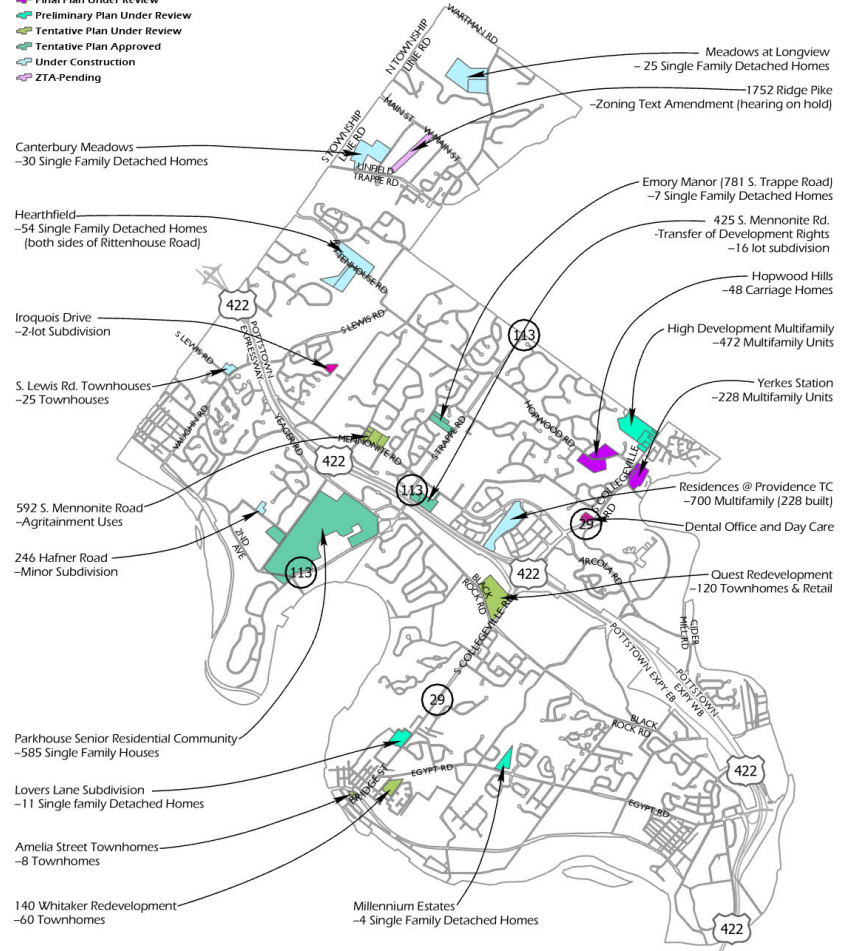


Development Map
