

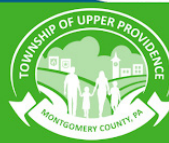

## Understanding the Upper Providence Open Space Referendum

On July 21 the Upper Providence Township (UPT) Board of Supervisors voted to authorize an open space referendum to appear on the November 4, 2025 general election ballot. The full text of the referendum ordinance and ballot question is available on the UPT website. But in simple terms, the referendum asks voters to vote yes or no to authorize a dedicated open space tax. Its general intent is to protect UPT's remaining natural resources and scenic landscapes, to maintain existing parks and open spaces and to provide the financial means to enhance these amenities when opportunities arise from willing sellers to purchase additional open space, trail easements, development rights, and floodplain structures, to name a few.

### Why the Referendum Now?

In the past two decades, UPT has grown substantially, now being 95% developed. Over 2,000 approved residential units are pending development, which will impact our police, fire, emergency services, and schools. When a new

residential unit is proposed, officials often hear the question, why doesn't the town just purchase the property? This referendum will allow voters to decide if the Township should have the financial means to buy open space. "This is a win/win opportunity," said Board Vice Chair Kelly Stevens. "It will address whether UPT voters are satisfied with the current open space or want the Board to be more proactive in preserving it. We will respect the voters' decision either way."

### Engagement of Natural Lands

In preparing the open space ballot question, the UPT Board engaged Natural Lands (NL) for technical support. Natural Lands is a 501(c)(3) non-profit land conservation organization dedicated to saving open space, caring for nature, and connecting people to the outdoors in eastern Pennsylvania and southern New Jersey. Natural Lands owns and manages 43 nature preserves, totaling nearly 24,000 acres. They hold 494 conservation easements and other restrictions on another 28,000 acres. In addition to building and managing a system of protected lands, Natural Lands operates as a full-service conservation organization able to offer open space financing acquisition through open space referenda, establishment of criteria and priorities for open space acquisition programs and land transaction assistance. NL's expertise was instrumental in updating the Township's Open Space Opportunities Map, which highlights potential areas for preservation and can be viewed on the Township's website.

## Understanding the Referendum (cont.)

Township will be offering scheduled public information sessions. On September 15, during the Board of Supervisors meeting, the Township Manager will present a brief overview of the referendum and answer any questions from residents regarding the estimated tax impact and how the funds will be used. Similarly, at the October 15, 2025 Planning Commission Meeting, officials from the Natural Lands will provide an overview and have secured special speakers to discuss how the proceeds may be legally used for certain open space initiatives.

### What's the Tax Impact for the Average Resident?

We have fielded several residential inquiries on how this new levy will impact them personally. However, answering this accurately depends on knowing their household earned income and the assessed value of their home. The BOS adopted a blended tax formula recommended by the NL. If adopted it increases the Township's Earned Income Tax (EIT) from 1% to 1.06% and the Real Estate Tax (RET) from 2.75 mills to 3.25 mills. The reason for this mixed rate is to ensure that both property owners and workers pay a fair portion of the open space tax.

#### Real Estate Tax Calculator

For perspective, the average assessed home in UPT is \$500,000. To calculate the open space tax, one would need to apply the following calculator:

Average Assessed Value	\$500,000
Proposed Tax Increase	.50 Mills
Calculation	$(\$500,000/1,000) \times .50$
Estimated Annual Tax Increase	\$250

#### Earned Income Tax Calculator

For perspective, the average earned income in UPT is \$141,771. To calculate the open space tax, one would need to apply the following calculator:

Average Earned Income	\$141,771
Proposed Tax Increase	0.06 %
Calculation	$\$141,771 \times .0006$
Estimated Annual Tax Increase	\$85

### How Can the Tax Be Used?

It is often thought that an open space levy can only be used to buy land, but this is incorrect. The NL and Township legal counsel have ensured the ballot question allows flexible use of these funds within state law. The funds may be used for any of the following:

- **Land Acquisition:** Buying land or conservation easements from willing sellers to safeguard natural areas, farms, and woodlands. Local funds are often combined with state and federal grants to increase the protected open space for each dollar spent.
- **Park and Trail Development:** Authorizing expenses necessary to plan for new public parks, extend the existing trail network and improve access to natural areas.
- **Habitat Restoration:** Funding projects to restore wetlands, streams, and other critical habitats.
- **Maintenance and Stewardship:** Ensuring the long-term care and management of preserved lands, including invasive species control and trail upkeep. Each year, up to 25% of the fund's accumulated balance from the tax authorized by referendum may be used to develop, improve, design, engineer, and maintain open space property.
- **Planning and Administration:** Covering the costs associated with identifying priority preservation areas, conducting appraisals, and managing the open space program.

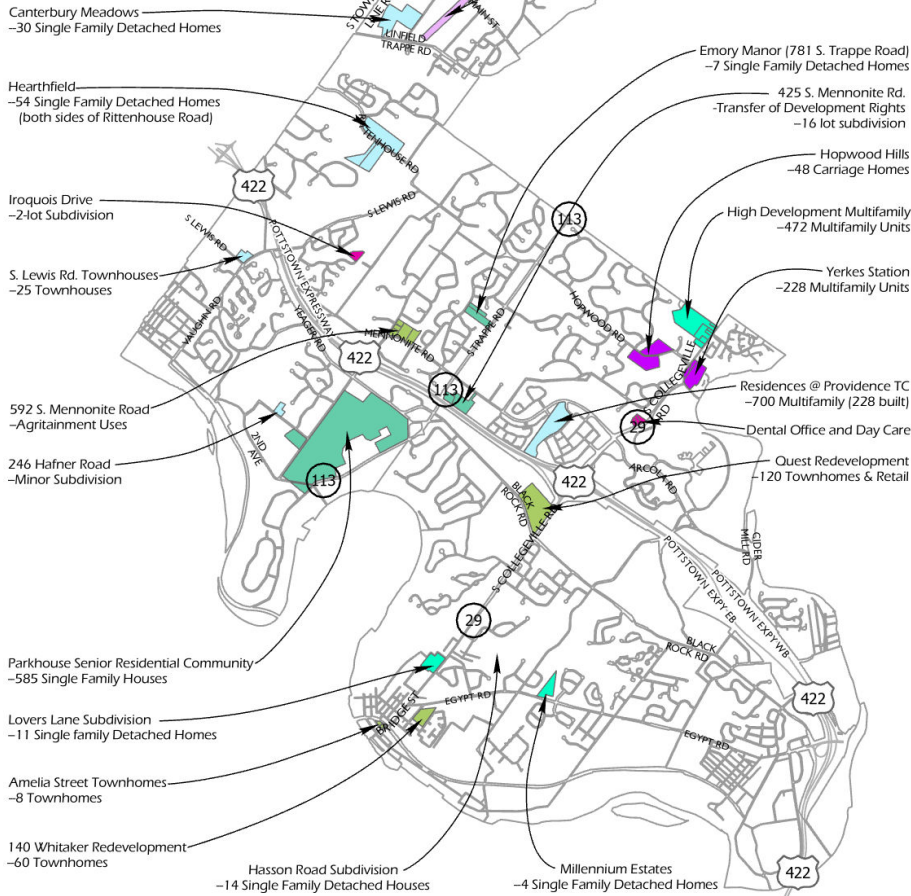

Parcels in Development or Under Construction as of July 21, 2025

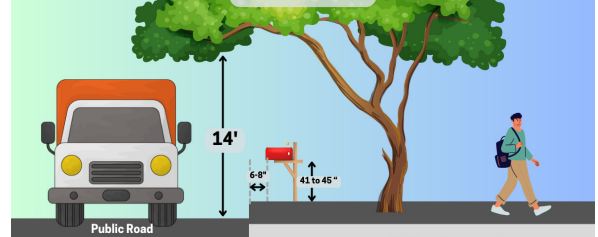

### Keep Streets Clear for Maintenance Vehicles



#### Street Tree Maintenance

Trees that overhang streets pose a hazard for maintenance trucks and plows. Street trees should be trimmed to at least 14 feet minimal clearance from the tree canopy to the street.  
Should your street tree canopy pose a hazard, township maintenance crews may need to trim the tree.

#### Mailbox Placement

- Position your mailbox 41" to 45" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry.
- Place your mailbox 6" to 8" back from the curb. If you do not have a raised curb, contact your local postmaster for guidance.



## Celebrating Public Works Heroes in UPT:

Behind every well-kept trail, safe playground, and successful community event in Upper Providence Township is the dedicated team of the Public Works. Though their work often happens quietly, their impact is felt every day in our parks, facilities, and neighborhoods.

The Public Works team is divided into four key areas—parks/grounds, buildings, sewer, and roads—with each division playing an essential role in maintaining and supporting our community spaces. The parks and grounds crew

maintains 83 acres of field space, 33 acres of weekly mowed land, and 5.5 miles of trails, all while ensuring the health and safety of park trees. The buildings team cares for township facilities, including five buildings and three satellite restrooms, while managing routine checks and necessary repairs. The sewer team helps care for the wastewater management for the township, and the roads team assists in road maintenance and street cleaning.

From mowing, tree care, and playground inspections to trash collection and event setup, the work of Public Works allows residents to safely enjoy parks, trails, and the Community Center. Their support shines especially during large events like the Car Show, UP Music Fest, and Fall Fest, when every division—parks, buildings, sewer, and roads—comes together to ensure success.

Residents can play their part too: by keeping parks clean, picking up after pets, and respecting facilities, you help Public Works keep UPT beautiful. Their dedication ensures our parks and community spaces remain safe, welcoming, and ready for everyone to enjoy.
